The Future Leaders Program is an exciting new program developed to provide a fantastic opportunity for potential young leaders in the Esperance/Ravensthorpe region. The Program has been designed to invest in the next generation of leaders by providing them with opportunities to learn and develop leadership skills to benefit the local region.

The Future Leaders Program will be delivered by Regional Development Australia Goldfields Esperance (RDAGE) in partnership with the Esperance Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ECCI) and South Regional TAFE. All partners recognise the value in building skills and competencies in regional areas that can reflect the unique environment of the region. A Memorandum of Understanding was created by the partners to highlight the importance each agency places on building the leadership and management skills of potential leaders.

Chair of RDAGE, Lee Jacobsen, said the Future Leaders Program is a positive opportunity to build capacity and provide skills for the next generation of regional leaders.
